The Lake Nojiri area is designated as "Myoko-Togakushi Renzan National Park".

The landscape and complex shoreline of Lake Nojiri, together with the beautiful mountain scenery, are typical of the natural beauty of Japan.

During the Glacial era, some 40,000 years ago, Naumann elephants inhabited the area in the vicinity of Lake Nojiri. Excavation of Naumann elephant remains have been continuing regularly at Lake Nojiri for over 50 years. Fossils unearthed from the lake are exhibited at the Nojiriko Naumann Elephant Museum.

The museum reopened after reconstruction in the spring of 2018, with a shop, café and a room designed to give an excavation site experience.
